## Adverbs - Comparison

<b>Steigerung mit</b>		
<b>-er / -est,</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- einige natürliche Adverbien,</li> <li>- Adverbien, die formgleich mit den Adjektiven sind,</li> </ul>	<i>soon - sooner - soonest</i>  <i>fast - faster - fastest</i> <i>hard - harder - hardest</i>  <b>auch:</b> <i>early - earlier - earliest</i>  <b>auch:</b> <i>easily - easier - easiest</i>
<b>more / most</b>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- einige natürliche Adverbien,</li> <li>- alle mit <b>-ly</b> von Adjektiven abgeleiteten Adverbien</li> </ul>
<b>unregelmäßigen Formen</b>		<i>well - better - best</i> <i>badly - worse - worst</i> <i>ill - worse - worst</i> <i>much - more - most</i> <i>little - less - least</i>

### Das Adverb in Vergleichssätzen

<b>Zum Ausdruck der Gleichheit:</b>  ... <b>as ... as ...</b>	<i>A fox runs <b>as fast as</b> a dog.</i> <i>He visits the National Museum <b>as often as</b> his teacher.</i> <i>My mother drives <b>as carefully as</b> my father.</i> <i>I speak English <b>as well as</b> my friend.</i> <i>A hamster does <b>not eat as much as</b> a rabbit..</i>
<b>Zum Ausdruck des Unterschieds bzw. der Ungleichheit:</b>  <b>Komparativ des Adverbs + <i>than</i></b>	<i>A cheetah runs <b>faster than</b> a dog.</i> <i>He visits the National Museum <b>more often than</b> his teacher.</i> <i>My mother drives <b>more carefully than</b> my father.</i> <i>I speak English <b>better than</b> my friend.</i> <i>A cow does <b>not eat more than</b> horse..</i>
<b>Zum Ausdruck des höchsten Grades:</b>  <b>Superlativ (mit <i>the</i>, wenn eine zu vergleichende Person/Sache/Gruppe mitgedacht wird)</b>	<i>A cheetah runs the <b>fastest</b> of all animals.</i> <i>My brother drives <b>the most carefully</b> of our family.</i> <i>He visits the National Museum <b>most often</b> at weekends.</i> <i>I speak <b>best</b> when I am in England.</i> <i>A hippo does <b>not eat the most</b> of all animals.</i>
